

OCEAN CONTAINER INSPECTIONS



All ocean containers must be inspected for contraband, foreign objects and other visible agricultural contaminants prior to loading and unloading. The following must be inspected:

- Inside/outside doors including door hardware
- Front wall
- Left side
- Right side
- Floor
- Ceiling
- Outside/undercarriage
- Fan housing (on refrigerated containers)

As a participant in CTPAT, Gore is making a firm commitment to enhance the security of goods moving through our international supply chain. Gore works to protect its supply chain from criminal activities such as drug trafficking, terrorism, human smuggling, and illegal contraband. 1. Verify seal against the BOL
2. Cut seal and place in designated area
3. Notify CTPAT@wlgore.com should there be any concerns
4. Please note that illegal contraband can be stored in modified pallets, hidden within products or among boxes and can also simply be added to a shipment in a box, bag or other receptable.
