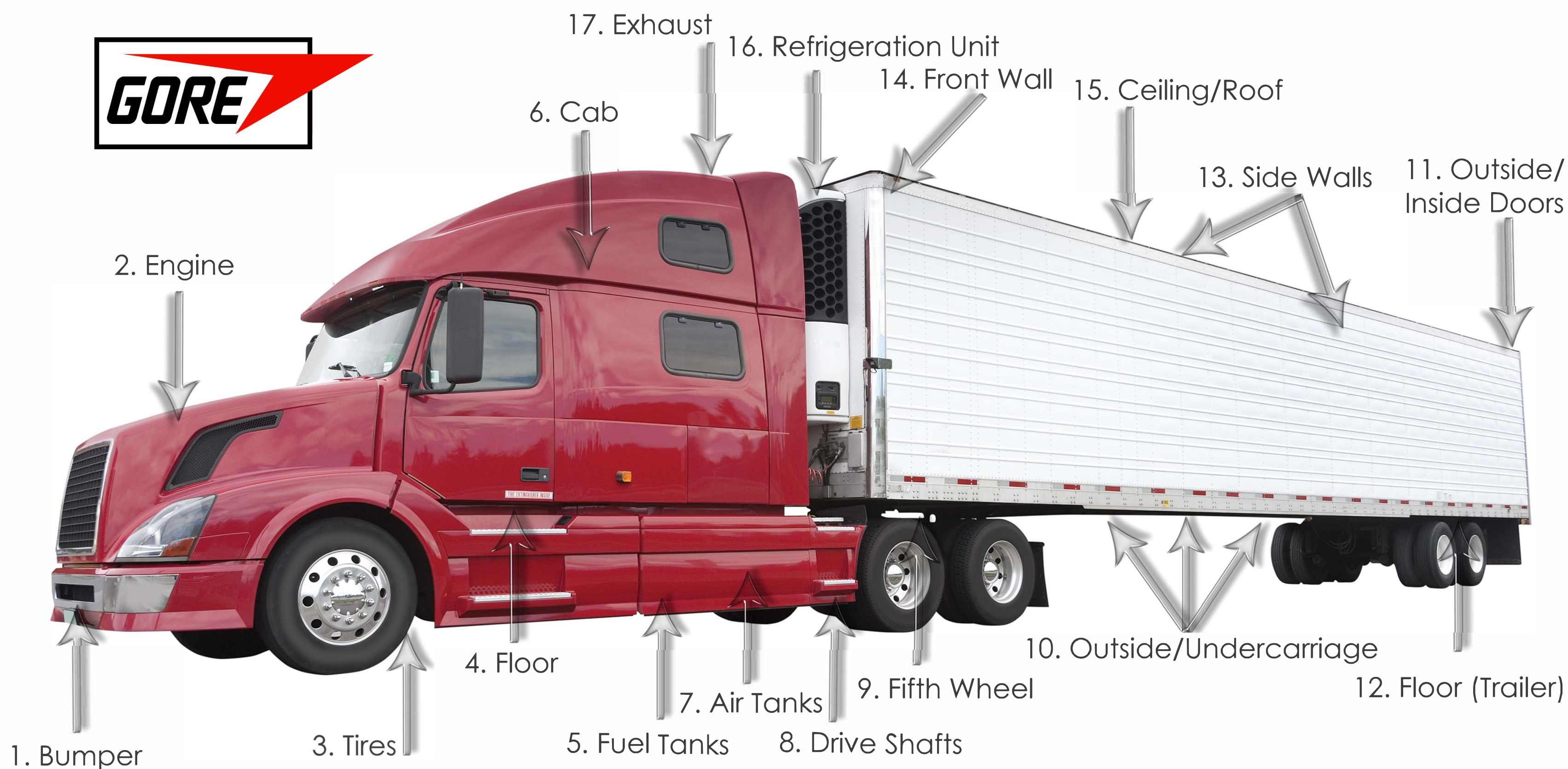


# Truck & Trailer Inspections



The interior and exterior of all trucks and trailers must be inspected just before loading and unloading. Each inspection must be documented.

Be aware of the following suspicious and unusual characteristics when performing inspections:

- scratches
- burn/weld marks
- loose or tampered rivets/bolts
- fresh grease
- after market modification
- fresh paint
- silicone
- fiberglass/bondo patchwork
- odor masking substances
- search for contraband, foreign objects and other visible agricultural contaminants
